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Construction on Interstate 49 Requires Overnight Lane Closure in Benton County

BENTON COUNTY (3-6) – Construction work on Interstate 49 in Bentonville and Rogers requires overnight lane closures on I-49, according to Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD) officials.

Beginning **Wednesday night, March 8,** crews will remove temporary concrete barriers, mill existing asphalt, and replace barriers along the inside lanes of northbound and southbound I-49. The inside lanes will be closed between Southeast Walton Boulevard (Exit 85) and Central Avenue/State Highway 72 (Exit 88) to allow for construction. Traffic will be controlled using signage and traffic barrels.

The lane closures will occur **Wednesday night, March 8 through Friday night, March 10, between 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.**, weather permitting.

This project (Job CA0902) is part of AHTD's Connecting Arkansas Program and includes widening 3.5 miles of I-49 to three lanes in each direction. The work extends from Highway 62/102 to Highway 72 and includes constructing auxiliary lanes from Highway 62/102 toward Southeast Walton Boulevard. Construction is expected to complete in late 2017.
