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Improvements to Interstate 49 Require Overnight Lane Closures in Benton County

BENTON COUNTY (03-30) – Construction work on I-49 in Rogers and Lowell requires overnight lane closures, according to Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD) officials.

Beginning **Sunday night, April 2**, crews will be performing the final asphalt paving on northbound and southbound I-49. The inside and outside lanes will alternately be closed from West Monroe Avenue/State Highway 264 (Exit 78) to New Hope Road (Exit 83) during this time period to allow for construction.

The overnight closures will occur Sunday night through Friday morning each week, beginning **Sunday night, April 2** and ending **Friday morning, April 21**, weather permitting. Traffic will be controlled using signage and barrels.

- Northbound I-49 lane closures will occur **between 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.**
- Southbound I-49 lane closures will occur **between 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.**

This project (Job CA0901) is part of AHTD's Connecting Arkansas Program and includes widening 5 miles of I-49 to three lanes in each direction. The work extends from Highway 264 in Lowell to New Hope Road in Rogers, and it is expected to complete in late 2017.
